

A Note from the Director...

As we prepare to share our production of *The Producers* with you, it's important for me to address the sensitive nature of its content, particularly in light of recent events that have reminded us of the weight of history and the impact of hate. Mel Brooks' musical, with its provocative humor and satirical take on Adolf Hitler and the Nazis, is a bold exploration of comedy's power to challenge and deflate even the darkest of ideologies.

Mel Brooks, a Jewish writer and comedian who served in World War II, spoke passionately about his intent behind this satire. He said, "After all the people that he was responsible for killing and after utterly destroying half the world, I just thought the only weapon I've really got is comedy. And if I can make this guy ludicrous, if I can make you laugh at him, then it's a victory of sorts." He further emphasized, "You have to bring him down with ridicule ... It's been one of my lifelong jobs — to make the world laugh at Adolf Hitler." These sentiments guide our production, underscoring that our aim is not to glorify but to use humor as a weapon against hatred.

Working with this cast has been an extraordinary experience. Their talent, passion, and dedication have brought this production to life in ways I could only have hoped for. In many ways, they've made my role as director almost superfluous, allowing their performances and creativity to shine brilliantly. I was charged with directing them, but it was certainly them who were teaching, challenging, and guiding me; I am forever grateful.

I also want to extend a heartfelt thank you to the KVTA board and the broader theatre community here in our little town. Their support, commitment, and collaboration have been the backbone of this production. When we needed help the most, the KVTA community rallied behind us, drill and paintbrush in hand, to lift us up and help us shine, proving yet again, that theatre is magical.

Thank you for joining us. I hope you laugh until your stomach hurts and tears stream down your hurts-from-laughing cheeks. Most of all, I hope you appreciate the depth of Mel Brooks' satire that aims to challenge rather than trivialize.


